This guide applies where you wish to restore individual files or folders only, from a previous backup.

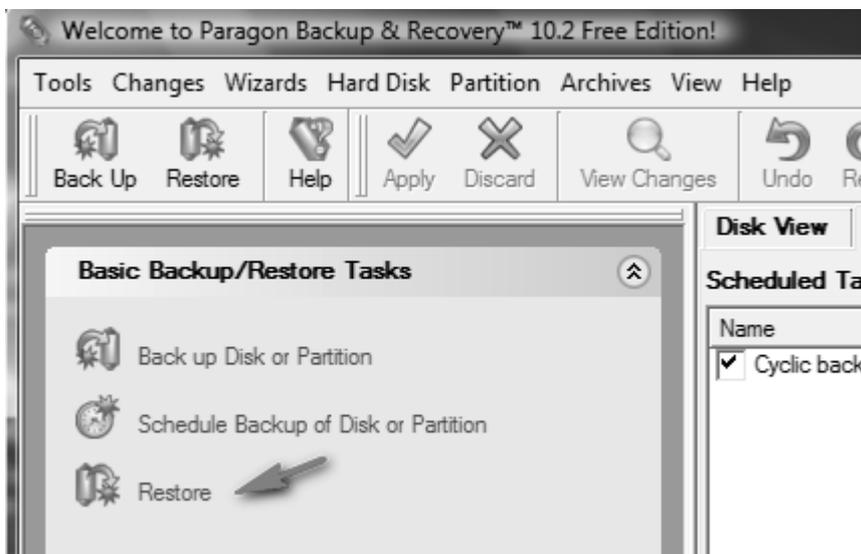

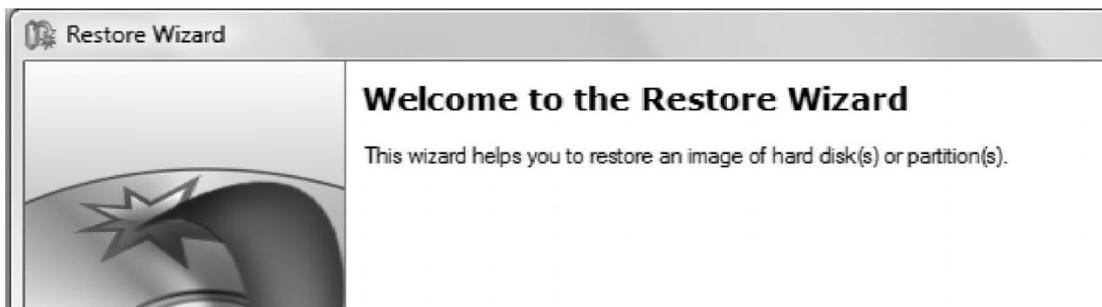
Follow all instructions carefully and always ensure you have a point of recovery to return to in case you encounter difficulties when implementing this process.

Guide starts here:

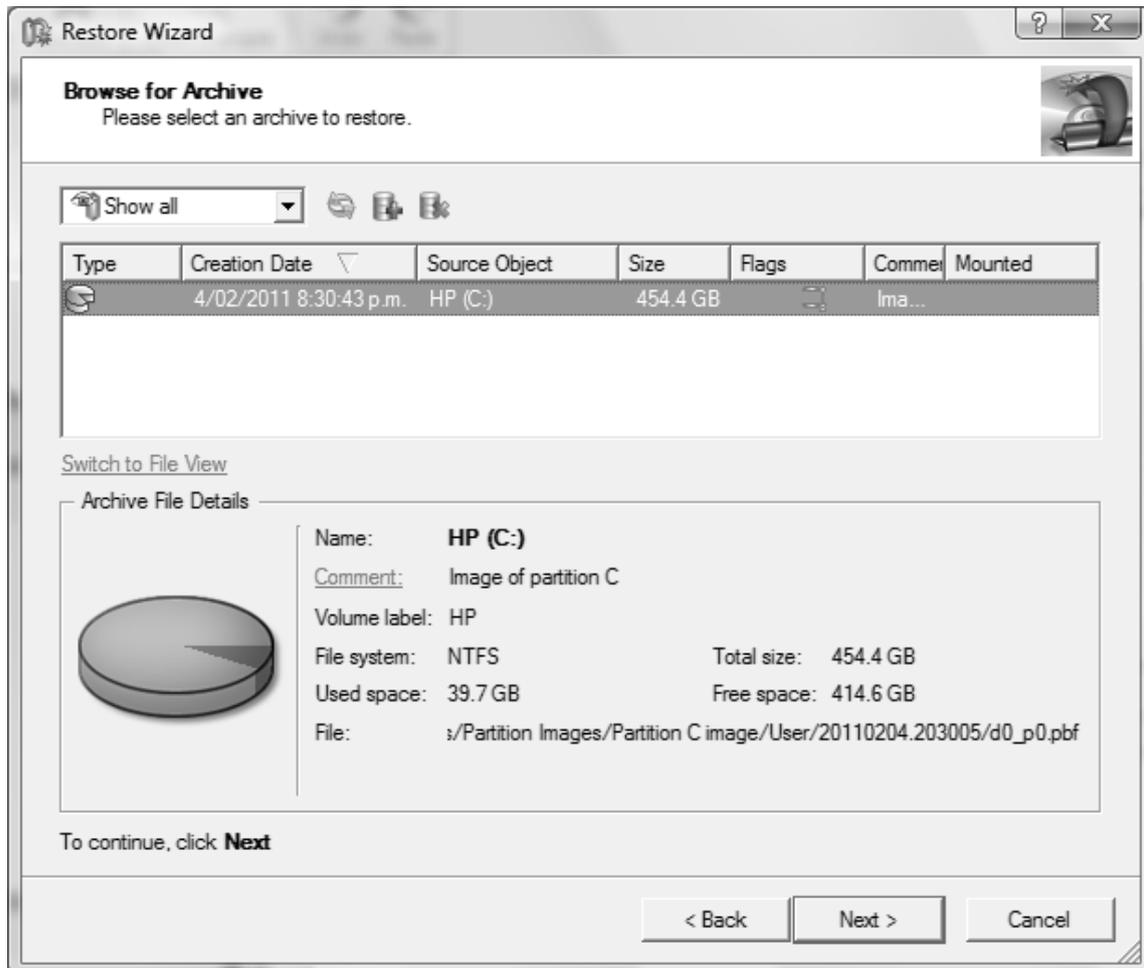
1. Open / start the B&R 10.2 software program.
2. Select the 'Restore' option from the left-hand side menu from within the Backup & Recovery program



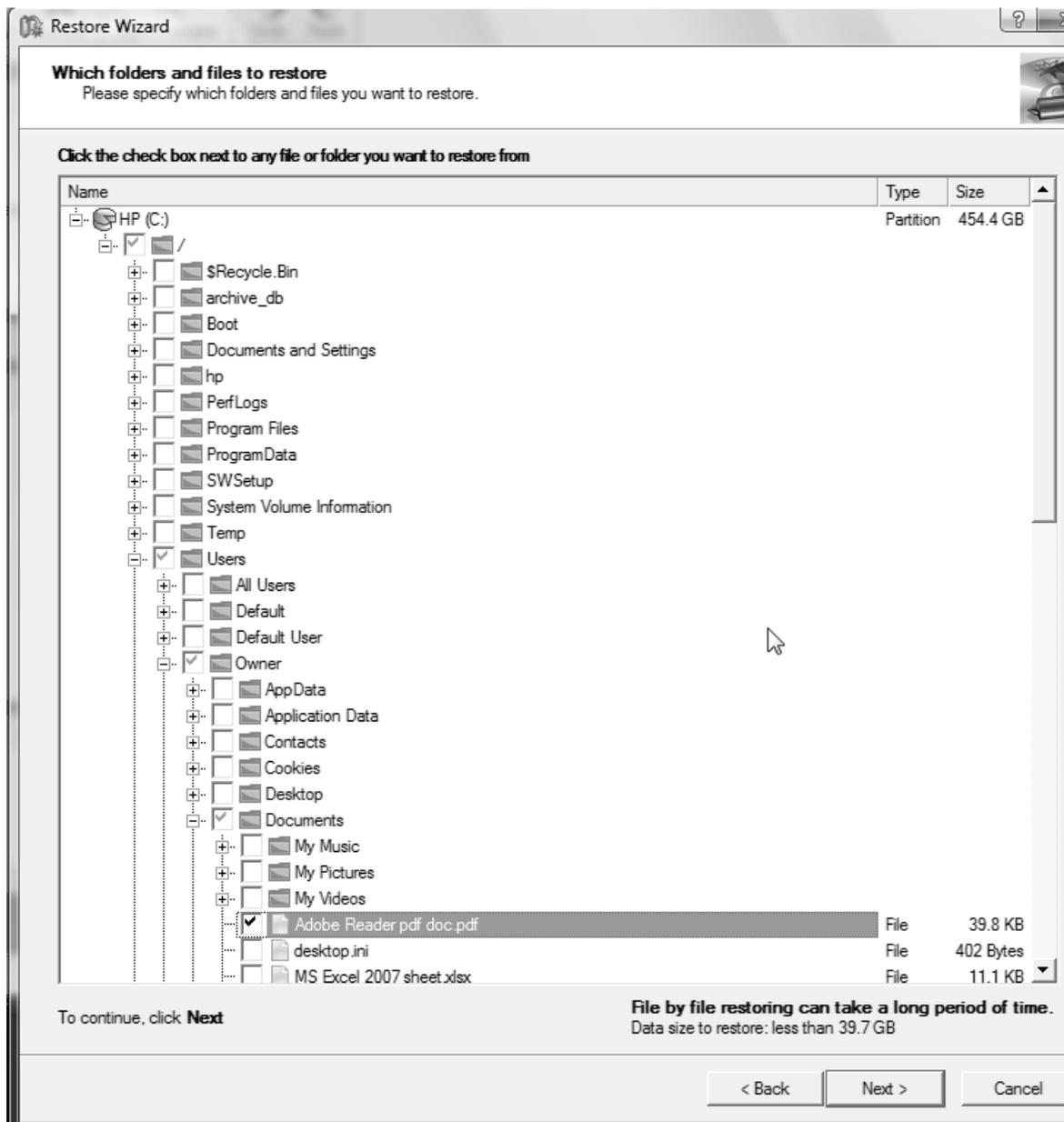
3. Select 'Next' at the 'Welcome to the Restore Wizard' window



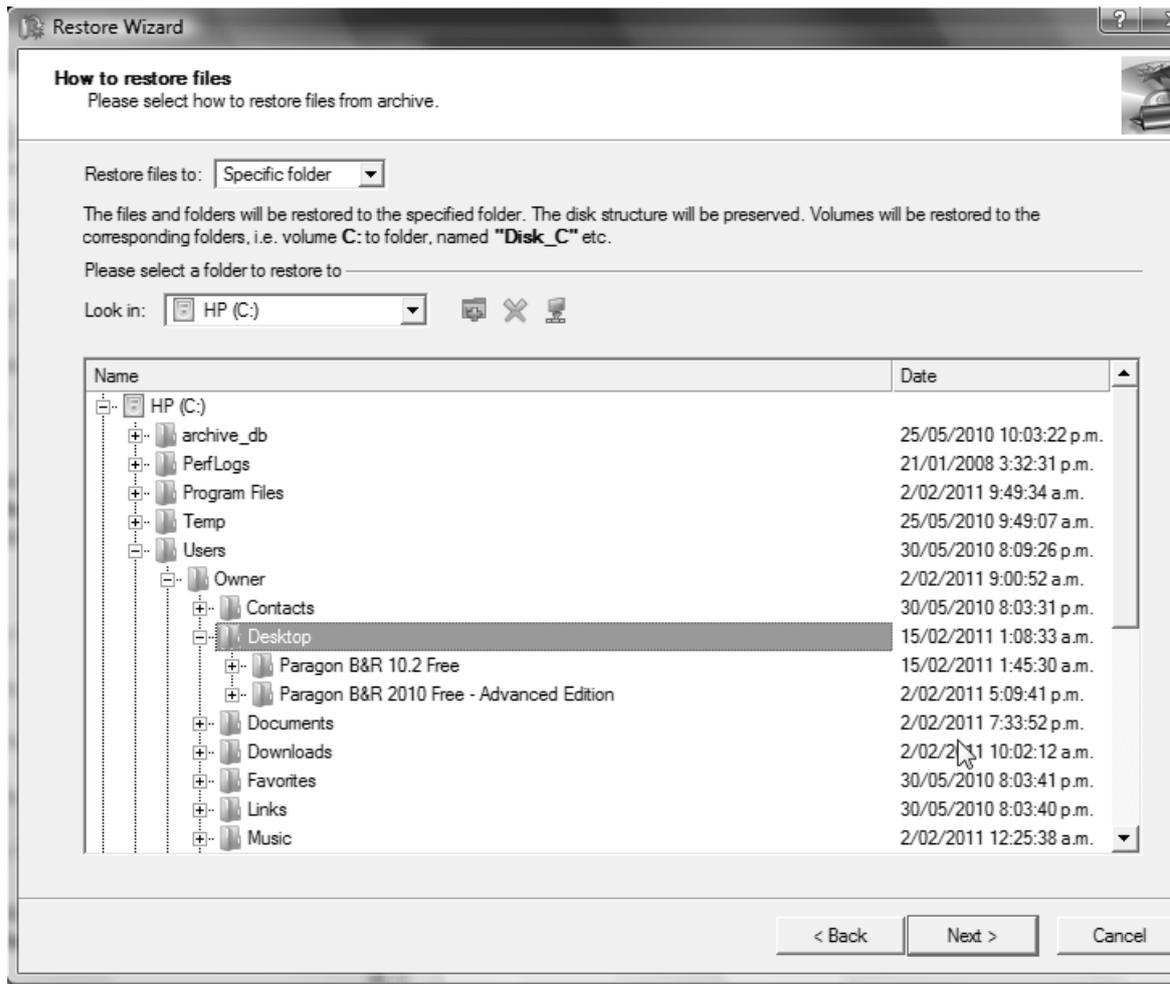
4. Highlight/select the backup entry on the 'Browse for Archive' window , from which you wish to restore the selected files or folders and select “Next” to continue



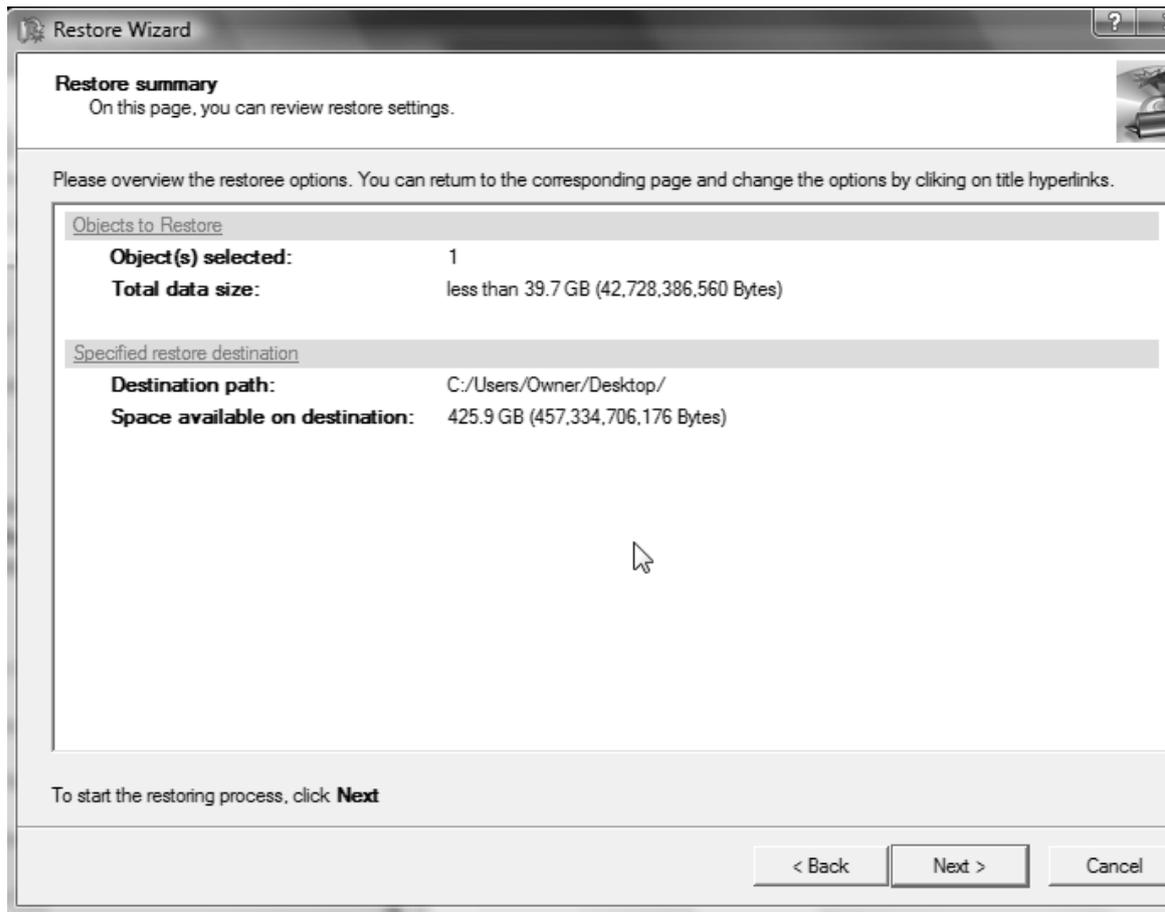
5. Expand the directory, select (check) only those items you wish to restore and select “Next” to continue”



- At the 'How to restore files' screen take the appropriate options. We recommend, to be safe, that you choose the 'Specific Folder' option eg. Specify the restore location as your desktop and then transfer the files once restored to where you want them using standard drag and drop.



7. Review the 'Restore summary' and if you're happy with it select 'Next' to continue



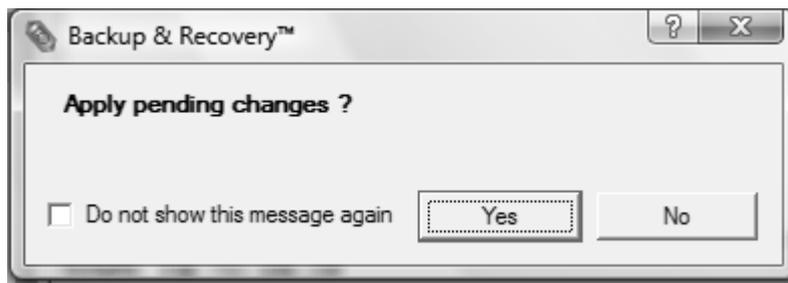
8. Select 'Finish' to perform the restore selection as specified



9. Select 'Apply' from the program menu bar to commit and start the restore



10. Reply 'Yes' at the pending changes window to confirm the restore is to proceed



Your selected Files and Folders will be restored and available (in this case) on your desktop in a folder names 'disk_C' preserved in their original directory structure from where the files can be transferred (drag and dropped) to the location of your choice.
